

Campus Sexual Violence Elimination Act (Campus SaVE Act)

UNC Charlotte prohibits sexual harassment, sexual assault, dating violence, domestic violence, and stalking among its students and its employees. The university can discipline community members who perpetrate these offenses and will provide services and accommodations to the victims of these offenses.
